

Cape District Six and Bo-Kaap Tour

Departing from Cape Town city centre, your first stop will be in the Bo-Kaap. Here we will tell you why the arrival of a small expedition of Dutch sailors in 1652 proved to be a monumental turning point in South African history. We will take a short walk along the romantic cobbled stone streets between the brightly coloured homes and your guide will explain how the framework of racial segregation was established.

A short drive passing some of Cape Town's landmarks will bring us to District Six where we will elaborate on the next tier in the South African story of the Apartheid. Once in District Six, we will drive through the decaying ruins of what was once a flourishing mixed-race community of 60,000 people. This area was later demolished and reserved exclusively for whites. We further explain the introduction of Apartheid, the legislation to justify the demolition of District Six and the consequences thereof.

Our journey continues to Langa, the oldest Black African Township in Cape Town. On arrival at Langa, we will have a photo opportunity at the site that commemorates the student uprising of 1976; we discuss the Pass Laws and the barracks that were built for African migrant workers. We then travel onto the Gugulethu and Amy Biehl memorials, explaining the history of these two important memorials on the way. At the end of the tour, you return to the city.
